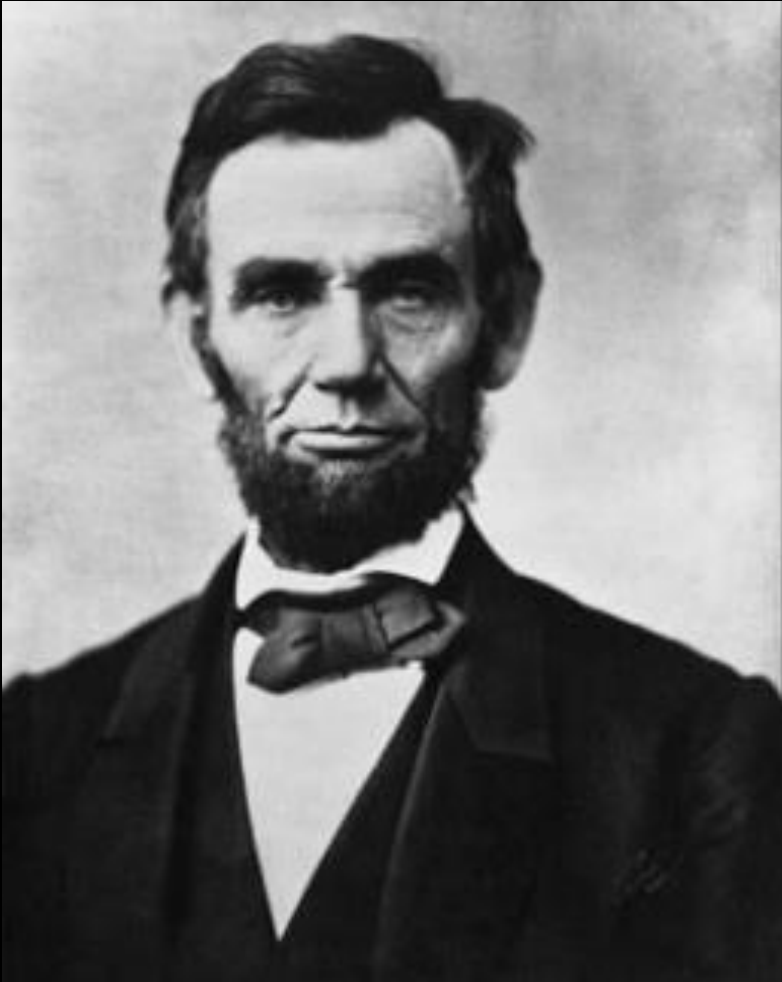

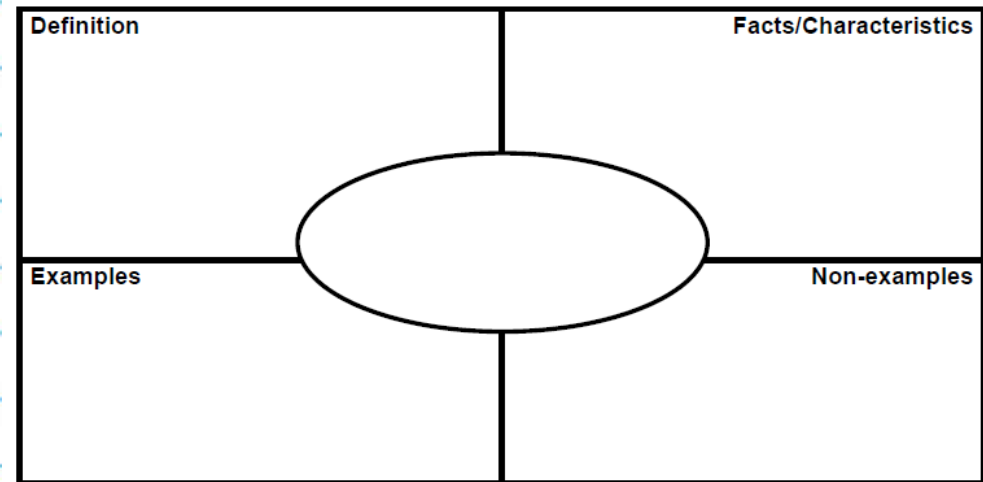

A **primary source** is a document or object created during a **specific time**.

A primary source **provides a firsthand account of an event** or the original evidence for study.

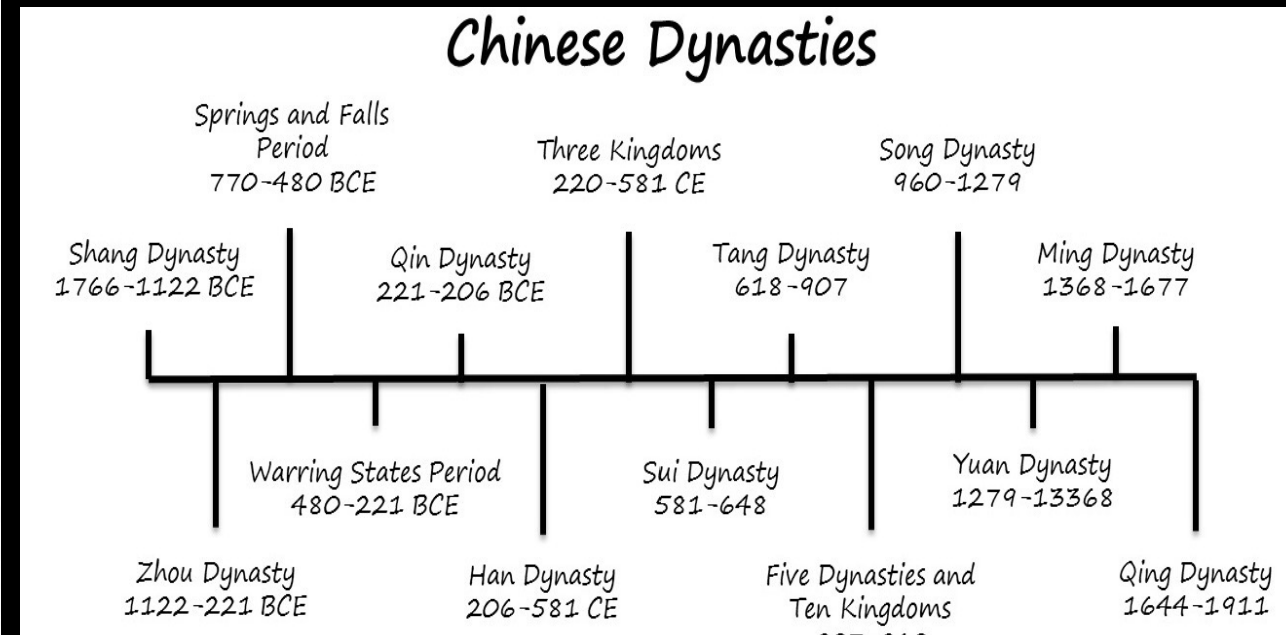
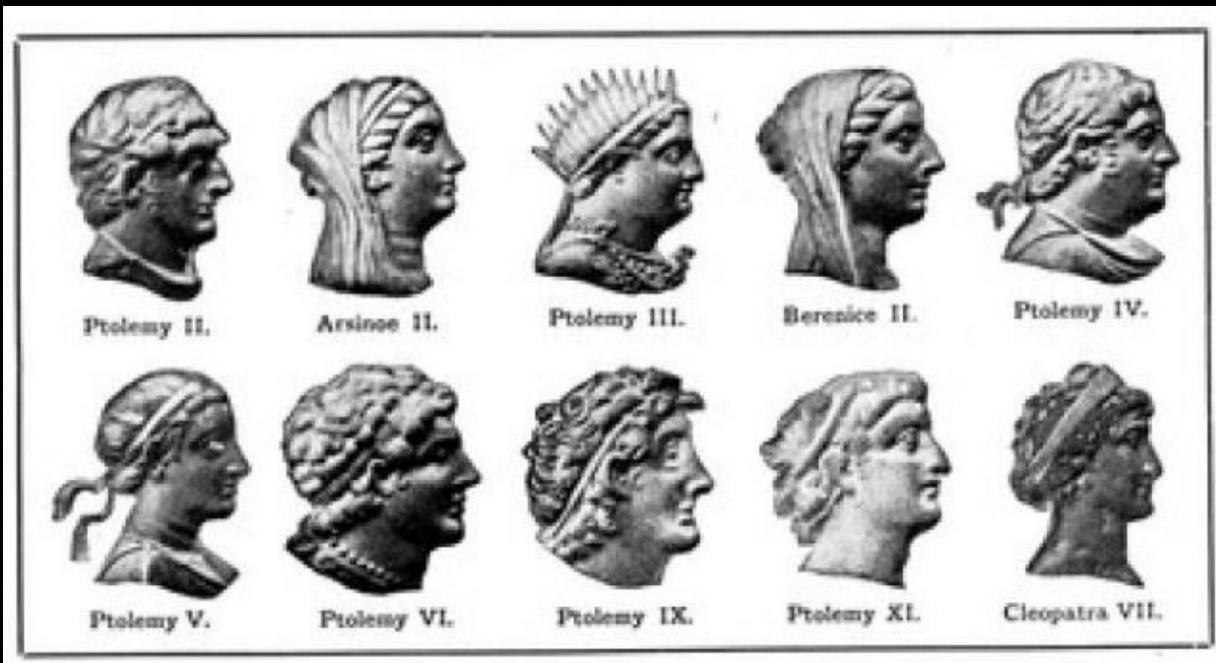


# Dynasty

## Modern Definition

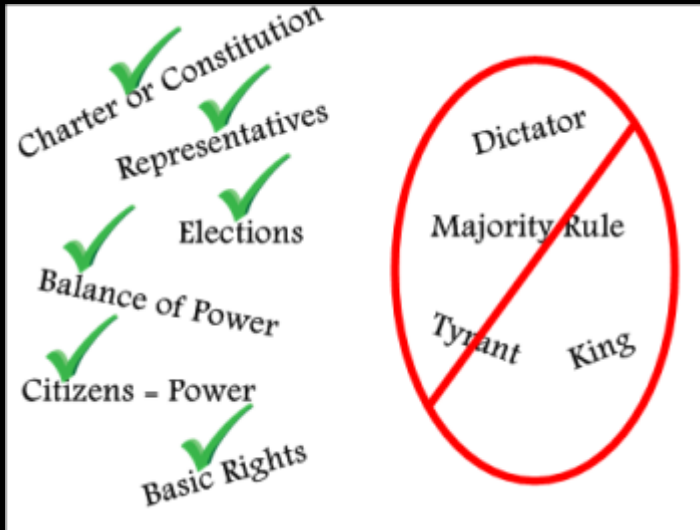
Divine Rule; power comes from deity

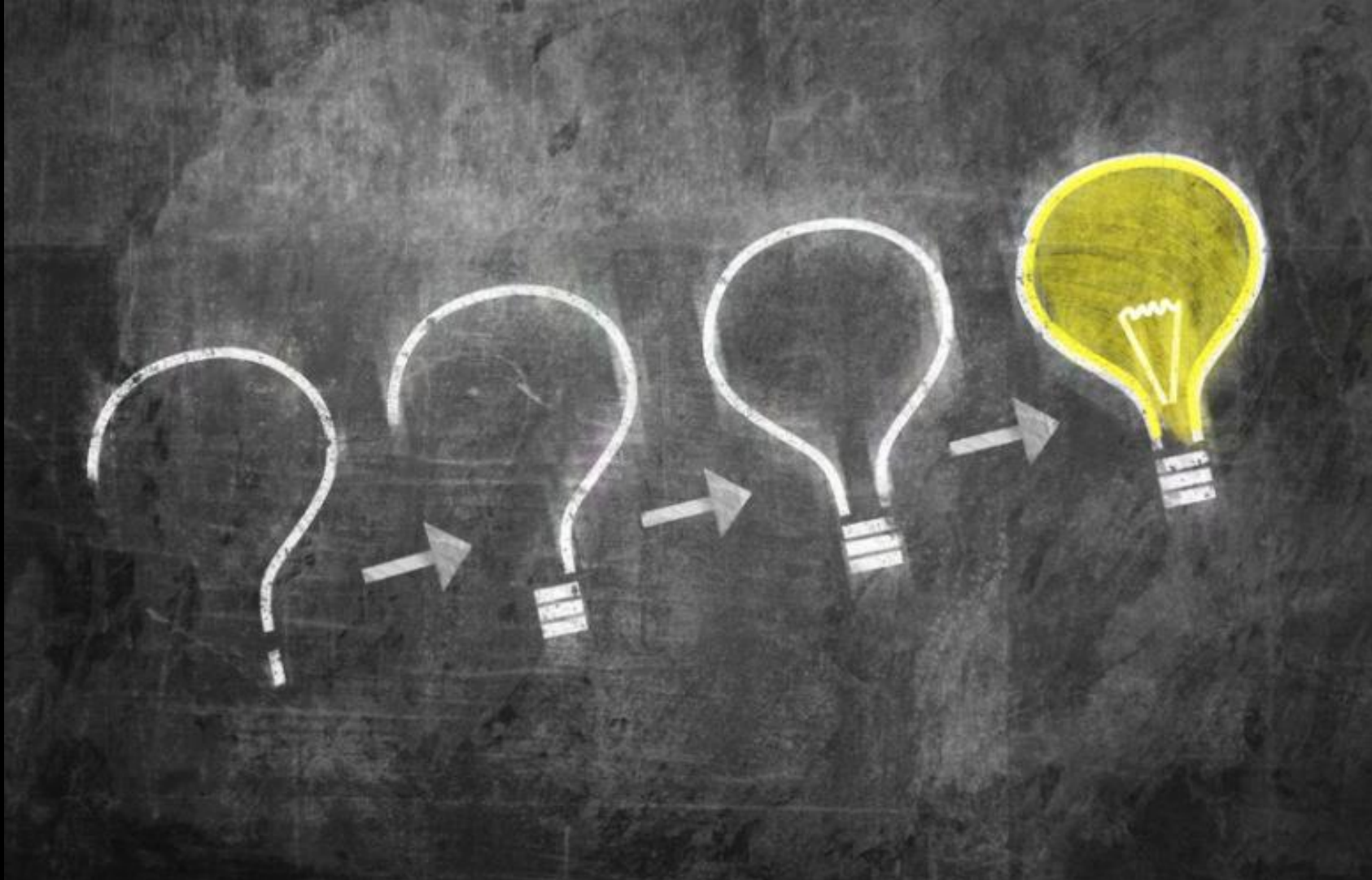

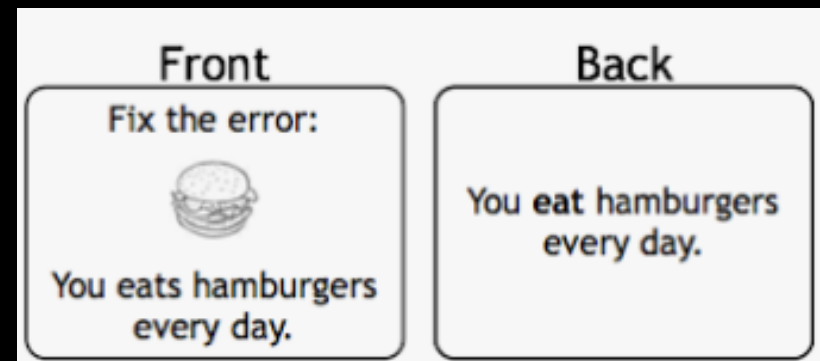
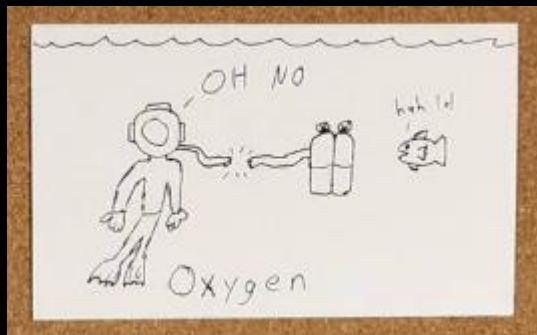


# Flashcards
