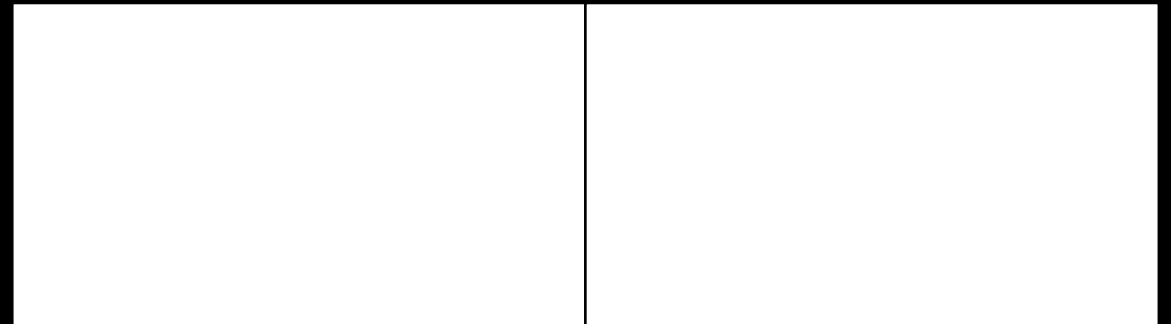

- From 1378 to 1417 there were three popes.

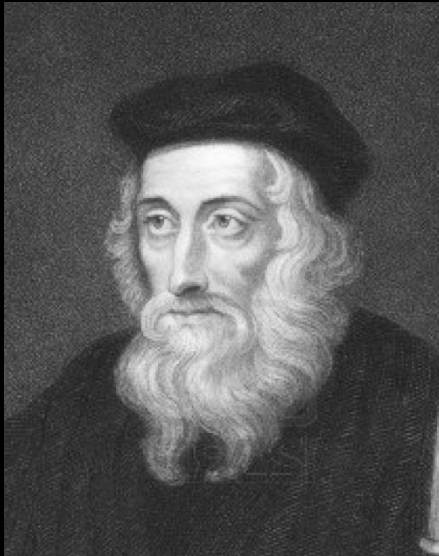

Religious Conflicts

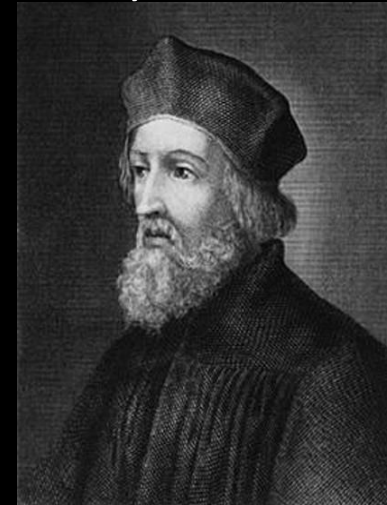
• John Wycliffe

- Preached that Jesus was head of the church
- Bible alone was the final authority
- Biblia por sí sola era la autoridad final
- Spread idea to have English bible



• Jan Hus

- Authority of the bible higher than the Pope
- Autoridad de la Biblia más que el Papa
- Excommunicated, tried as a heretic or non-believer, burned at the stake



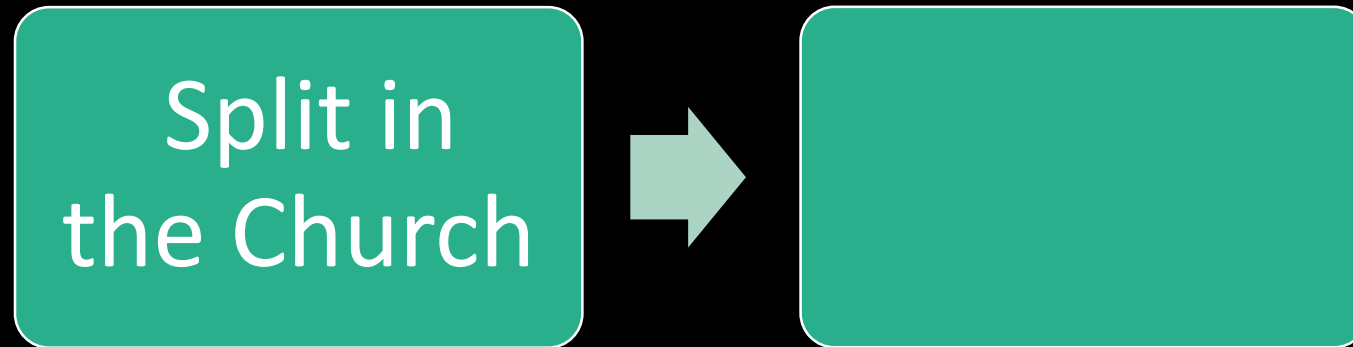

Hundred Years War

- Who: France and England
- When: 1337 to 1453
- Cause: Fought over Land / Causa: Luchó por la tierra
- Outcome: English driven out of France
 - Resultado: Inglés expulsado de Francia
- How: The longbow used made the knight ineffective
 - Cómo: El Arco largo utilizado hace ineficaz el caballero
- Joan of Arc
 - 13 year old heard voices and lead the French Army to victory in Orleans
 - Captured, tried as a heretic, and burned at the stake.
- Impact
 - Nationalism emerged
 - End of the Middle Ages, Age of Faith, and Chivalry

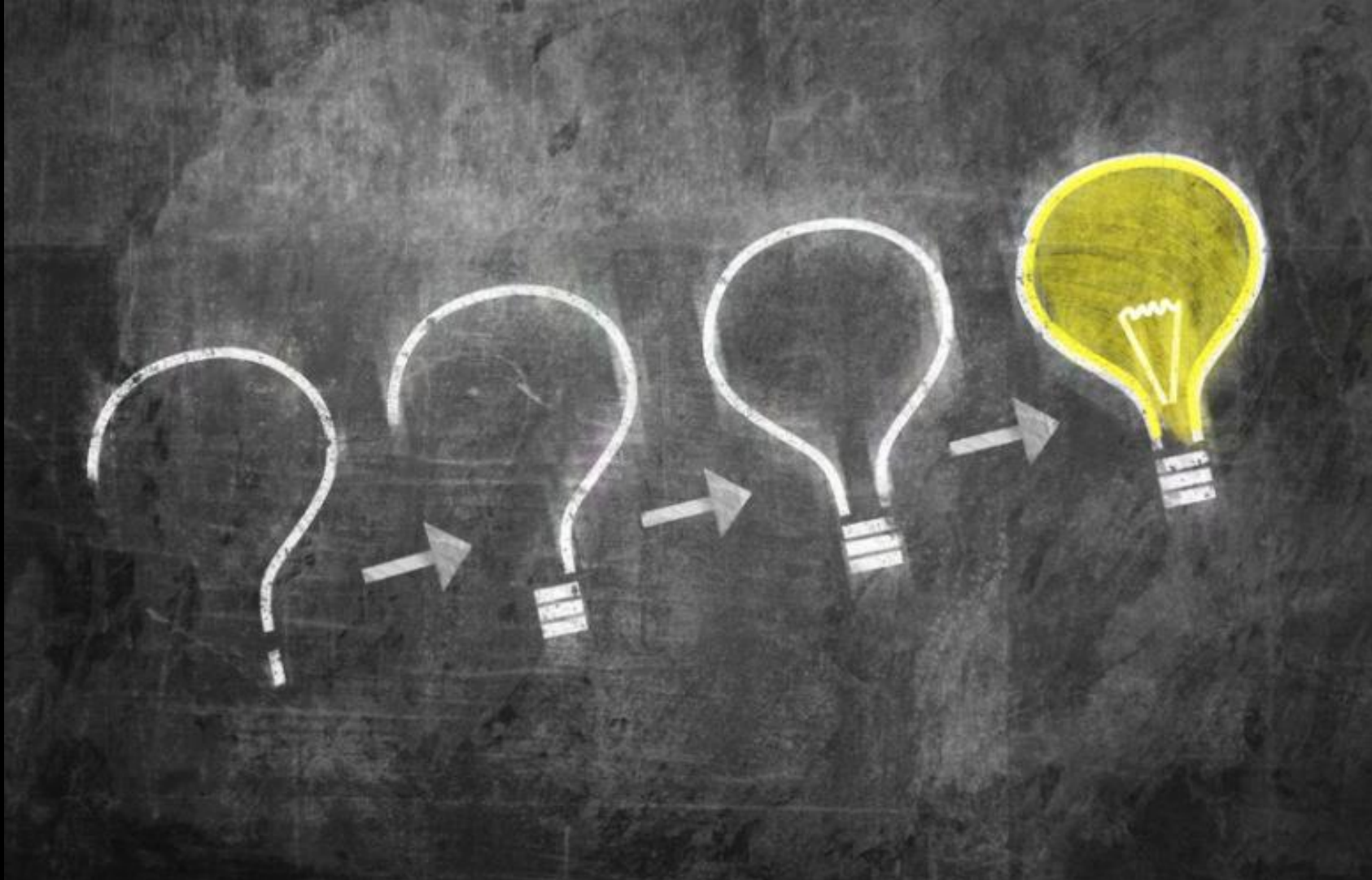

Black Death = Bubonic Plague

- Who?

- It had been occurring in Asia (China/Mongolia) for hundreds of years.
- Mongols brought it across Asia and used it as a biological weapon

- What?

- Bubonic Plague
- Transmitted by fleas and rats. Rats carried it. Fleas infected.
- Killed over 350 million people world wide

- 14th century (1300s)

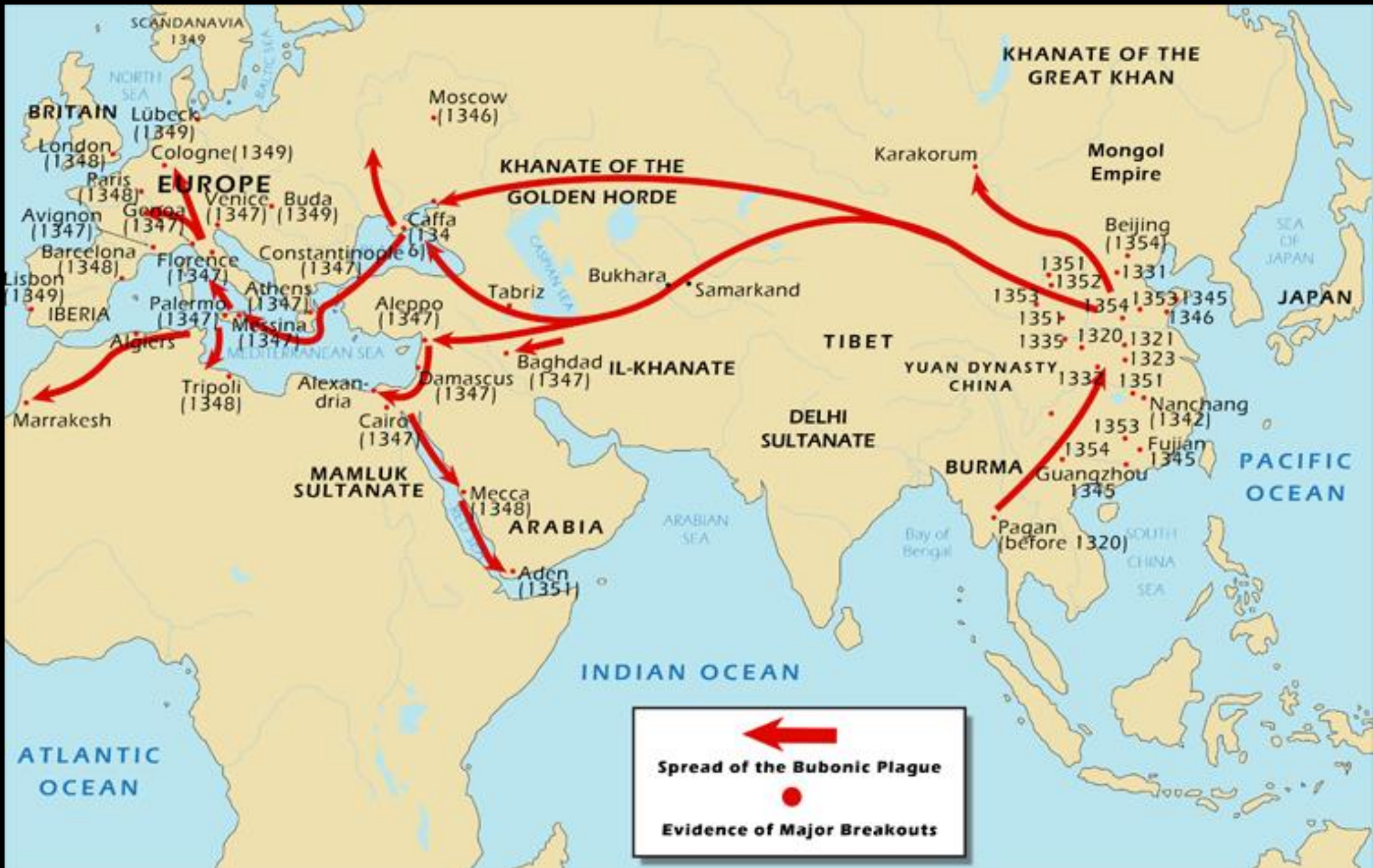
- Where?
