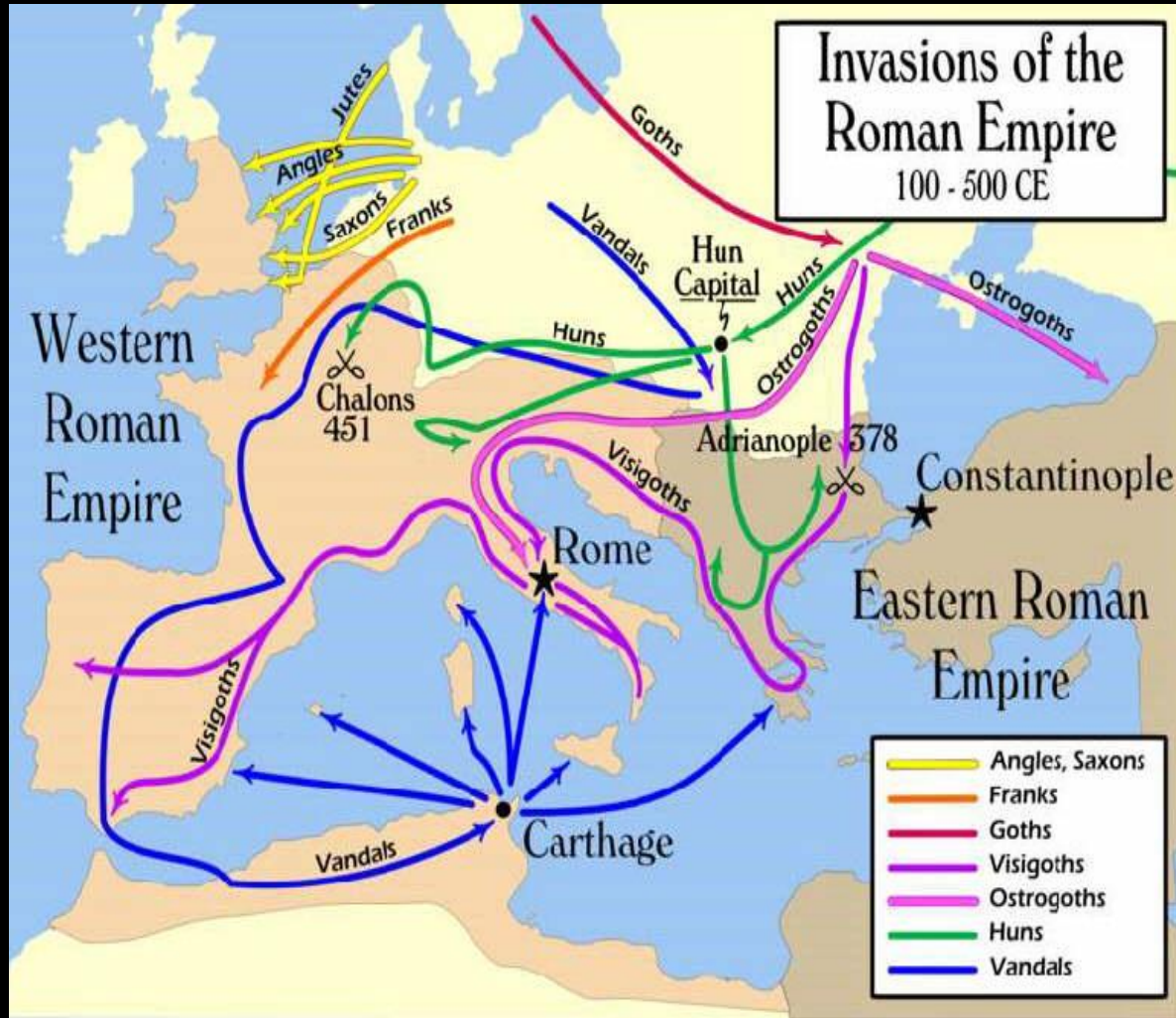

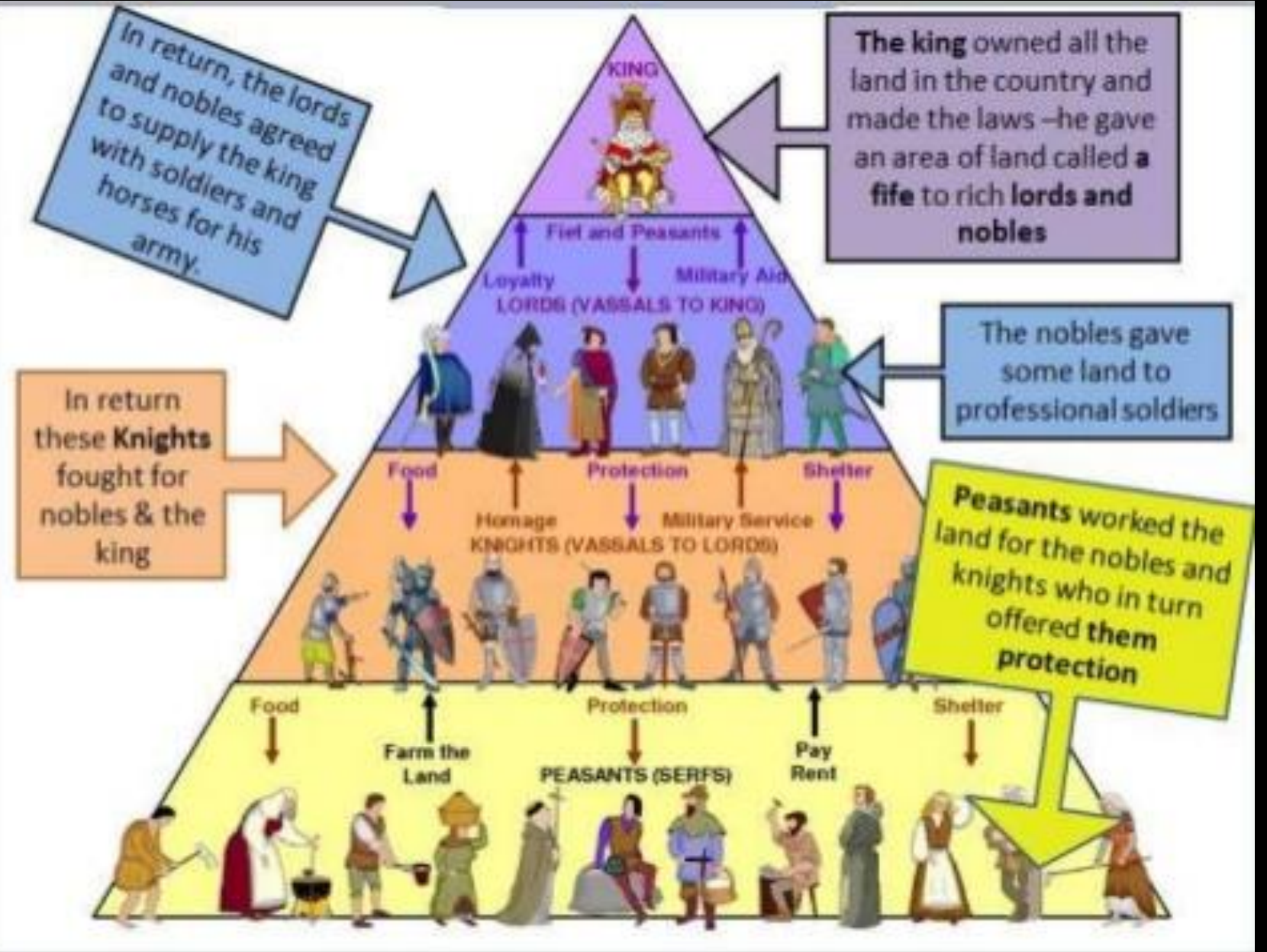

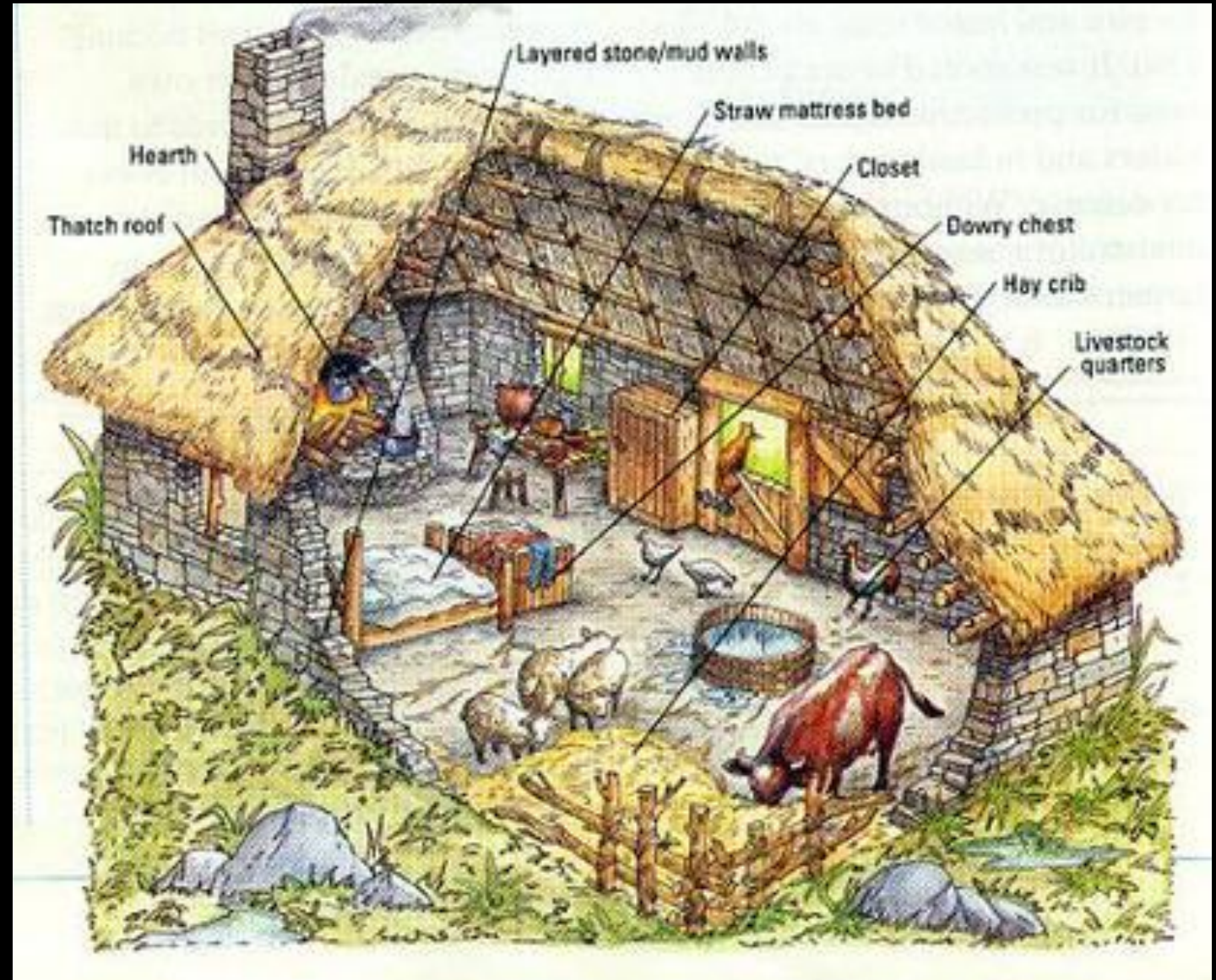

The Church and the State

The Church: Structure

Ranks of clergy or religious officials.





The Church



- Christianity offered stability during turbulent times
- Back to Basics (Age of Faith) 900-1500
- Three things that unified Christians.
 - All are equal on the path to salvation
 - All followed Canon Law – Church's law
 - All could be punished in church courts including Kings
 - Excommunication – banishment from the Church

Conflict between Church and State

Church did not like that Kings controlled the clergy



Pope Gregory VII

- 1075 outlawed lay investiture
- Excommunicated Henry IV
- Made Henry IV wait in the snow for three days before reversing punishment

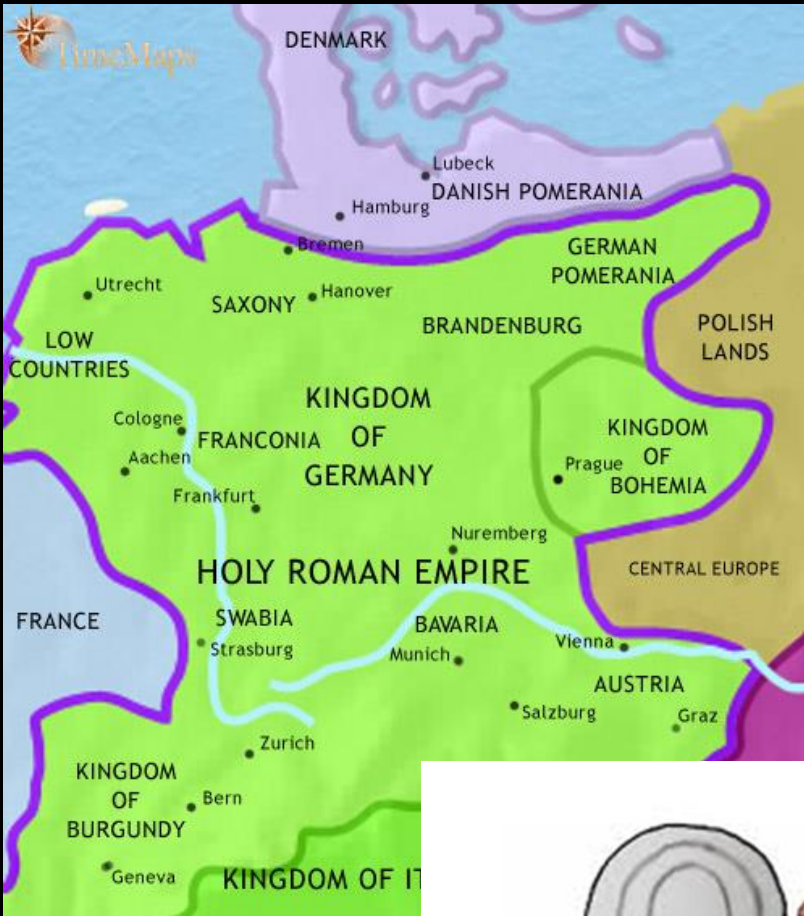


German Emperor Henry IV

- Tried to push out Pope Gregory
- His people turned on him so he begged the Pope to forgive him
- Humiliated but politically survived

Compromise

- Came to a compromise in 1122.
- Concordant of Worms
 - Two provisions or decisions
 - Church alone appoints clergy
 - Emperor has power to veto appointments



Conflict Again

- Fredrick I was a Holy Roman Emperor in 1155
- His empire was feudal territories
- Unsuccessfully tried to invade Papal States and Italy.
- Lost clout or influence with his kings.
- His empire collapsed when he drowned in 1190.



With Conflict comes Change

- Age of Faith
 - New sects of the Catholic church emerged
 - Dominicans, Benedictines, Franciscans
 - Cathedrals built in the city with new architecture

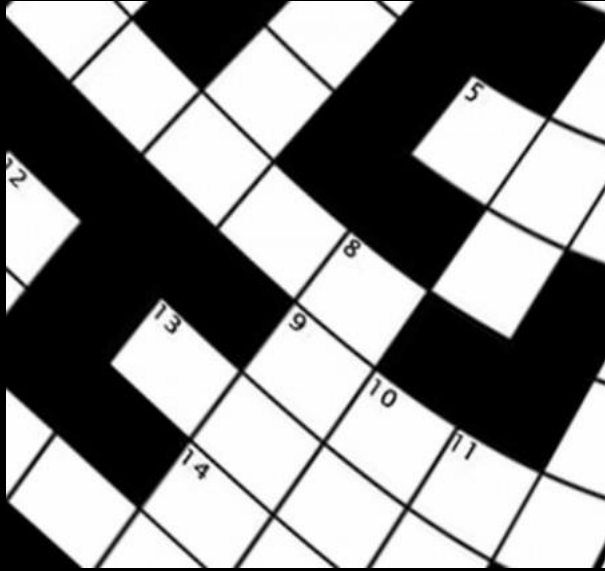
Electronic Submission Rules

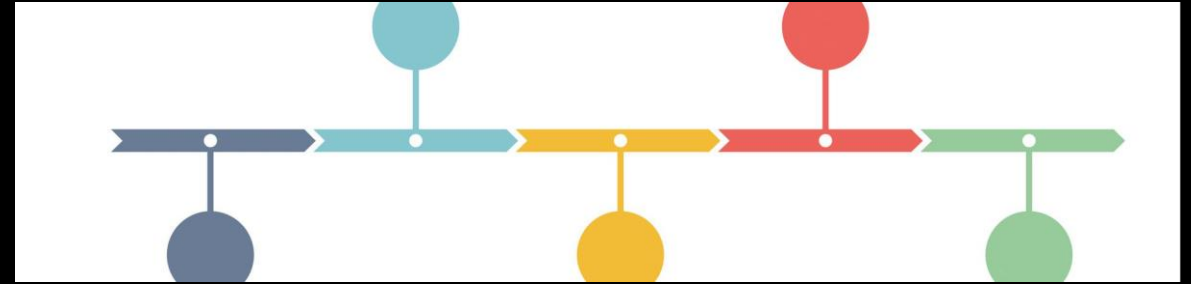
