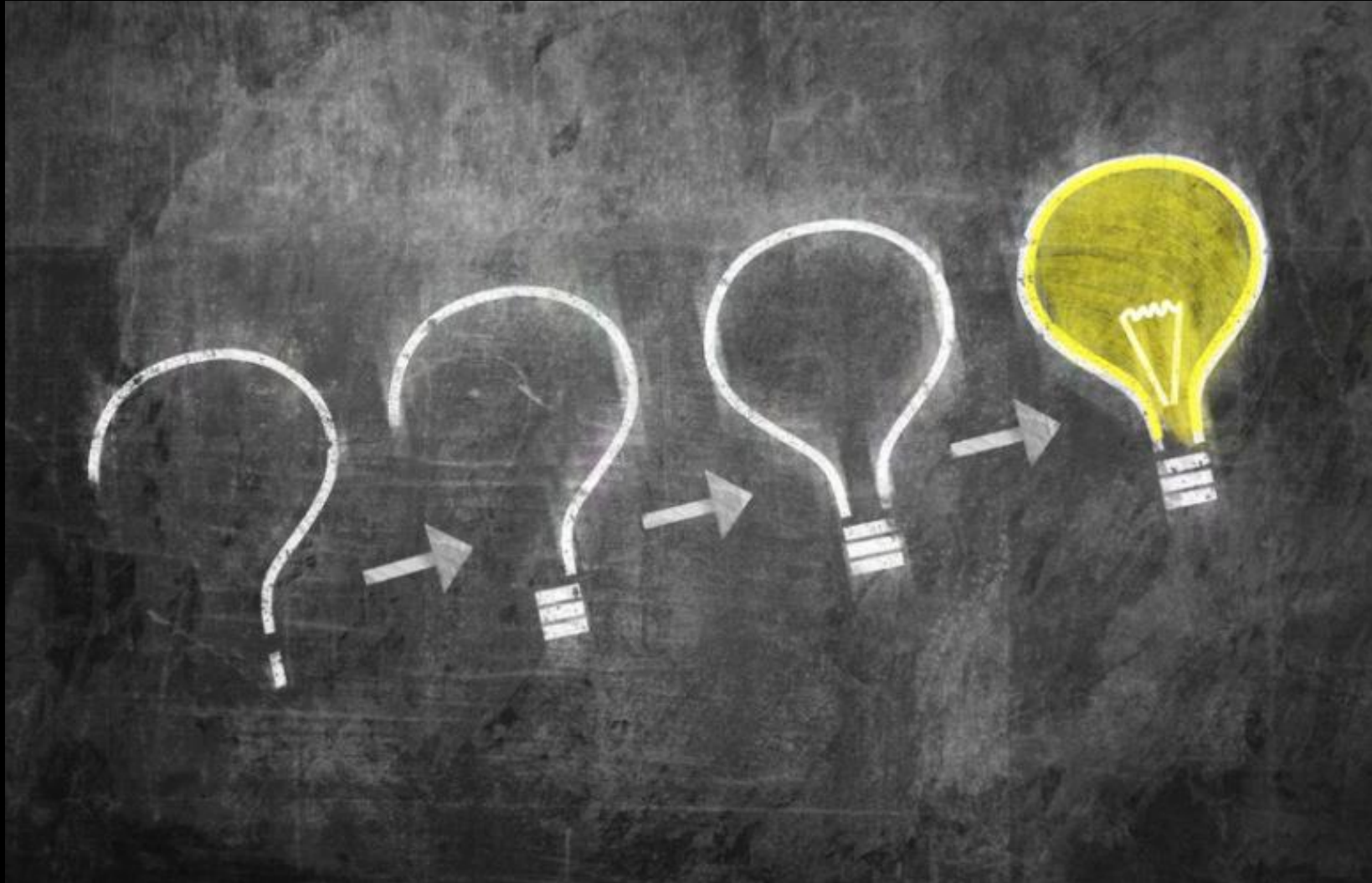

Imperialism and the Berlin Conference

What was the Berlin Conference?

The Berlin Conference of 1884–85 was organized by Otto von Bismarck, the first chancellor of Germany. The purpose of the Berlin Conference was to regulate European colonization and trade in Africa by identifying which European nations would be allowed to control which parts of Africa. The Berlin Conference was seen as the beginning of the “Scramble for Africa.” The “Scramble for Africa” was the invasion and colonization of African territory by European powers between 1881 and 1914. During the Berlin Conference, the European nations literally divided Africa up between themselves, often creating quite artificial states that divided cultural, linguistic and ethnic groups. No Africans were invited to the Berlin Conference and no Africans took part in deciding how the continent would be “carved up.” In 1870, only 10 percent of Africa was under European control; by 1914 it had increased to 90 percent of the continent. By 1914, only Ethiopia and Liberia were independent African nations not under the control of European powers.

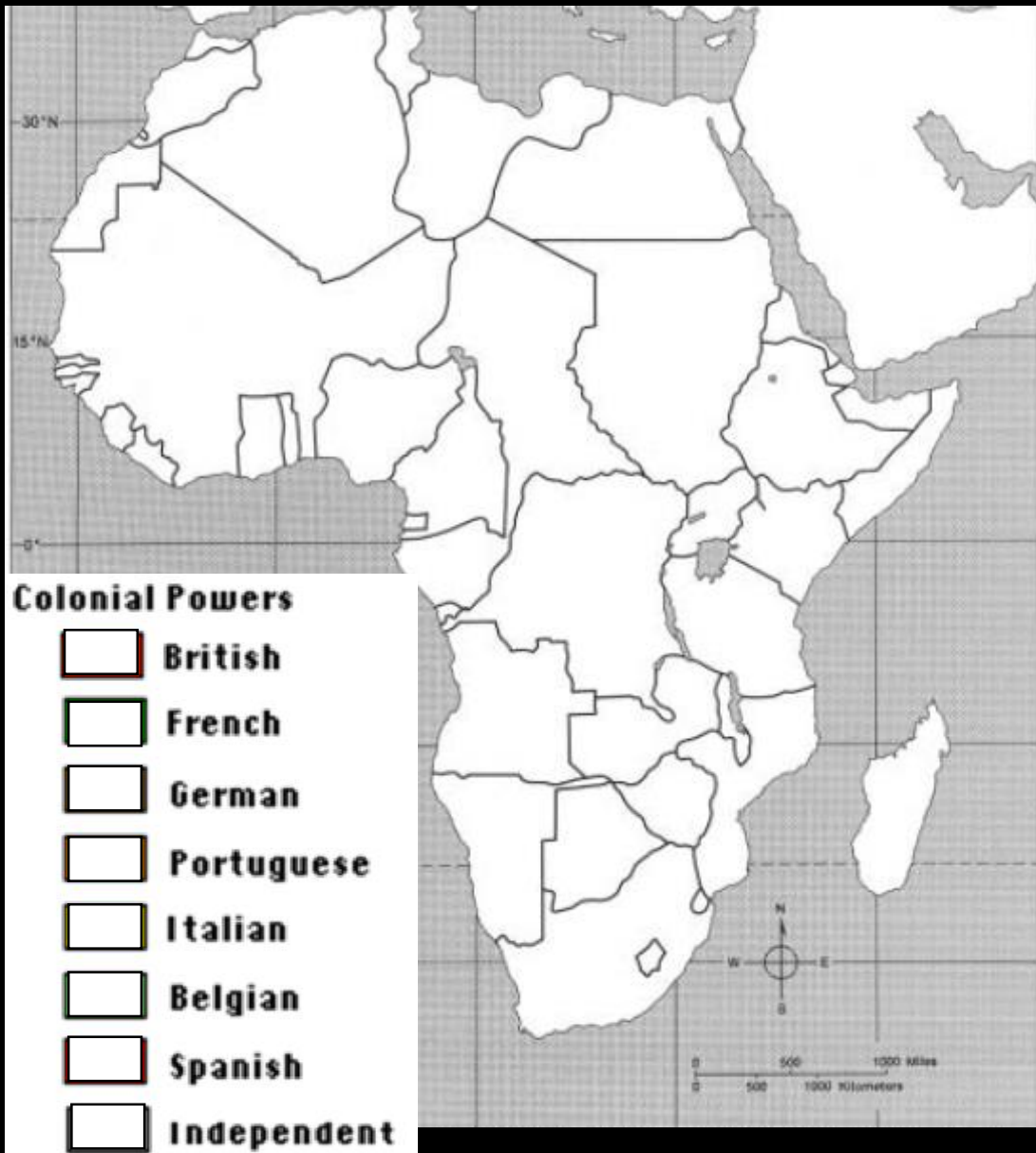

Imperialism in Africa

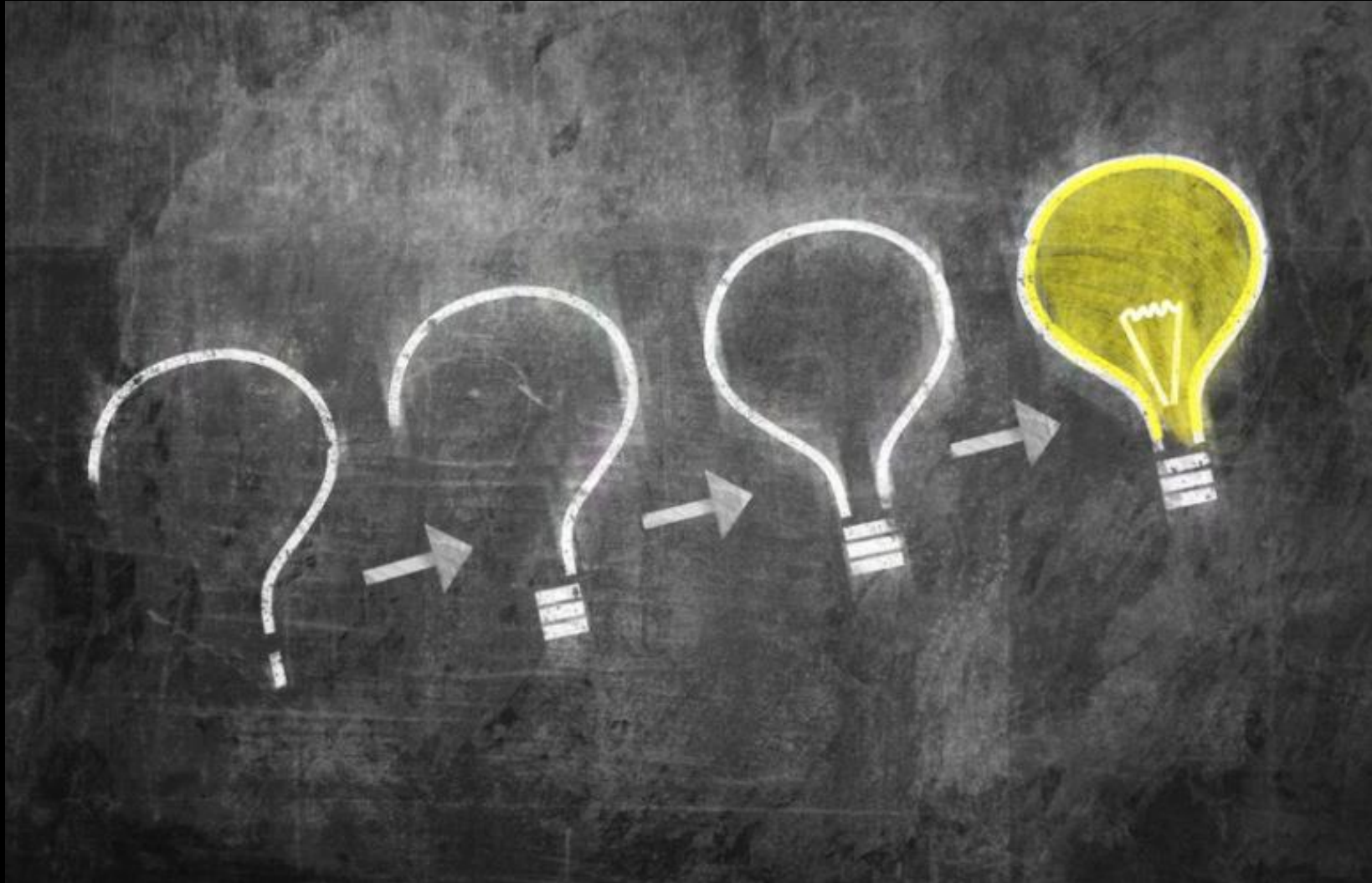

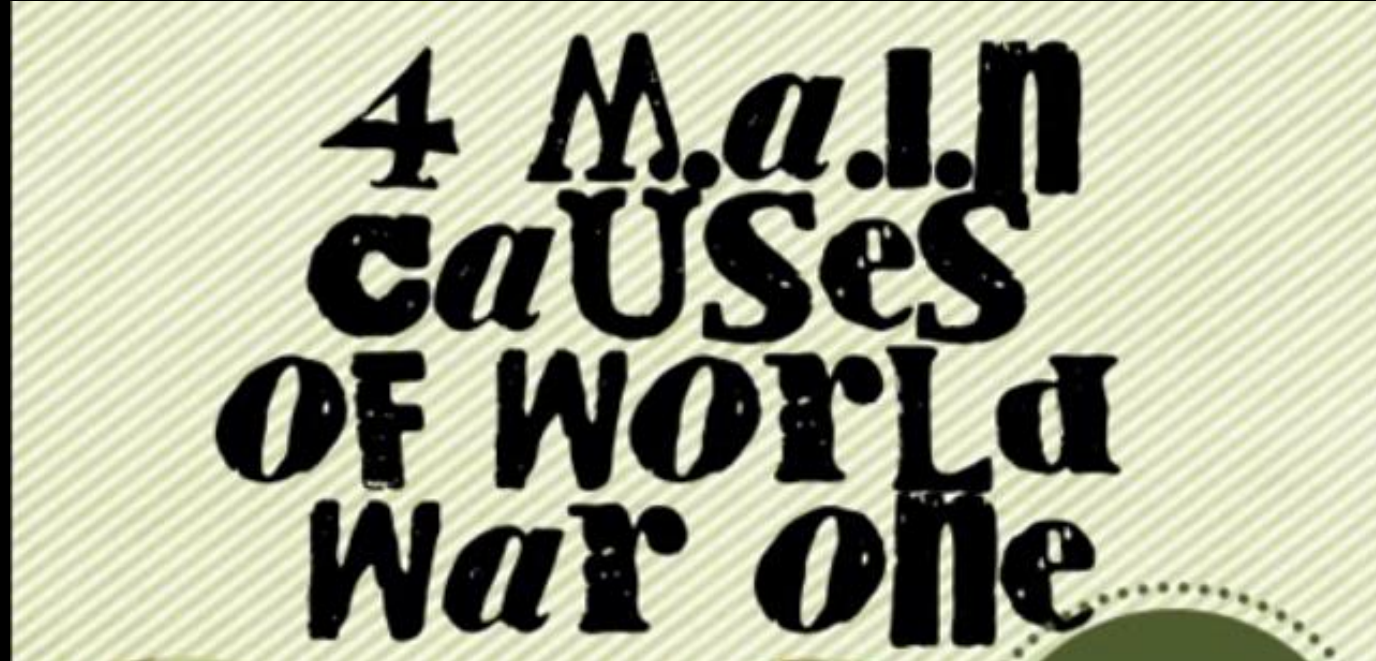

- Militarism is glorifying military power.

Por 1914, Europa tenía la mayor fuerza militar que el mundo había visto.

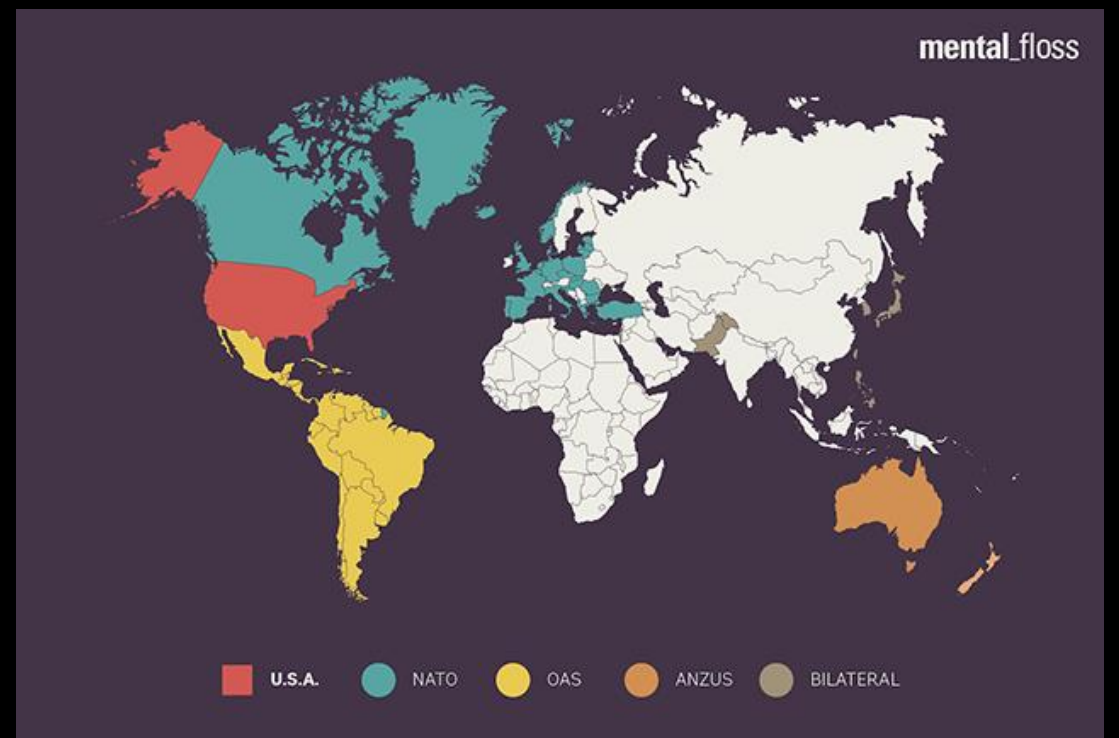
- Alliances- an agreement that is mutually beneficial

- Two Major Alliances
 - Triple Alliance/Central Powers: Germany, Austria-Hungary, and Italy
 - Triple Entente: Britain, France, and Russia
- An attack on one ally would be treated as an attack on them all!
¡Un ataque a un aliado sería tratado como un ataque a todos!

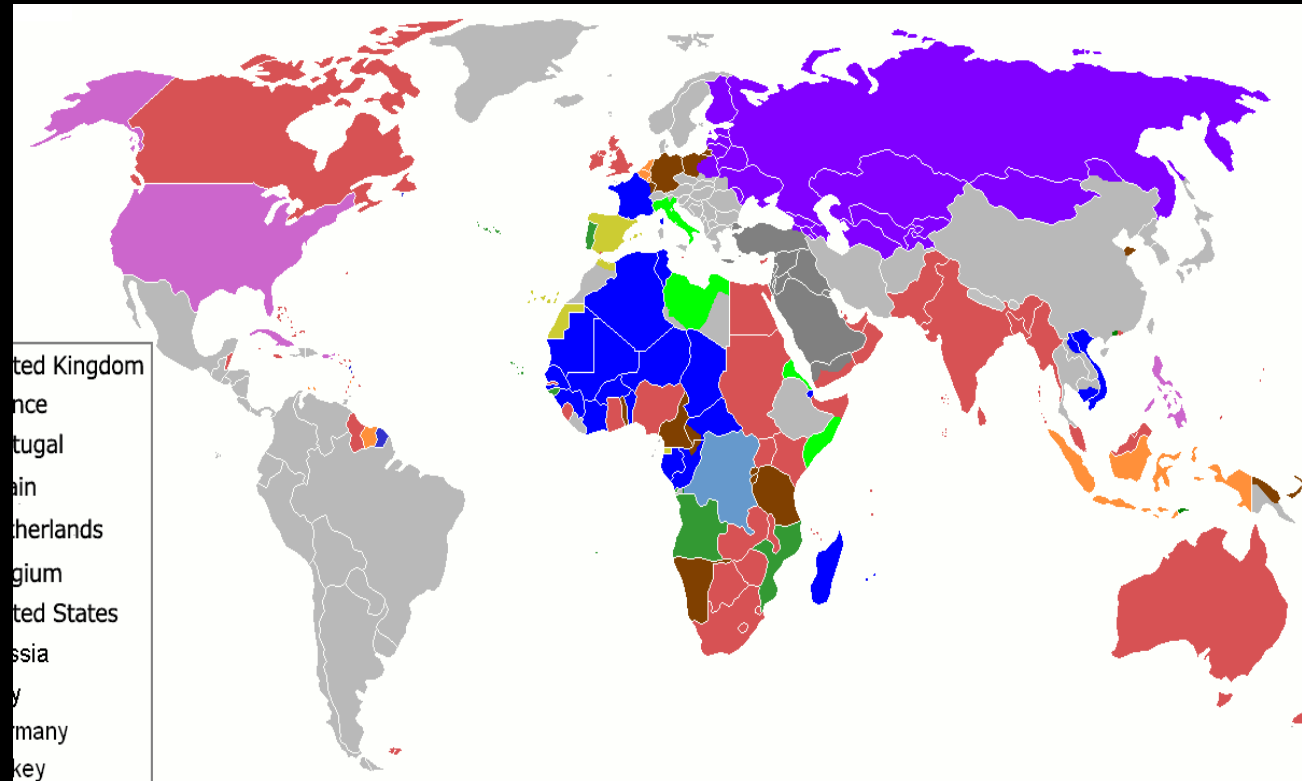


Alliances 1914 vs 2016



M.A.I.N. CAUSES

- Imperialism- seizure of another country by a stronger country.
Imperialismo - apoderamiento de otro país por un país más fuerte.
- Countries scrambled to create colonies to make money using a mercantilism.
 - To protect imperial interests, armies and navies were raised.

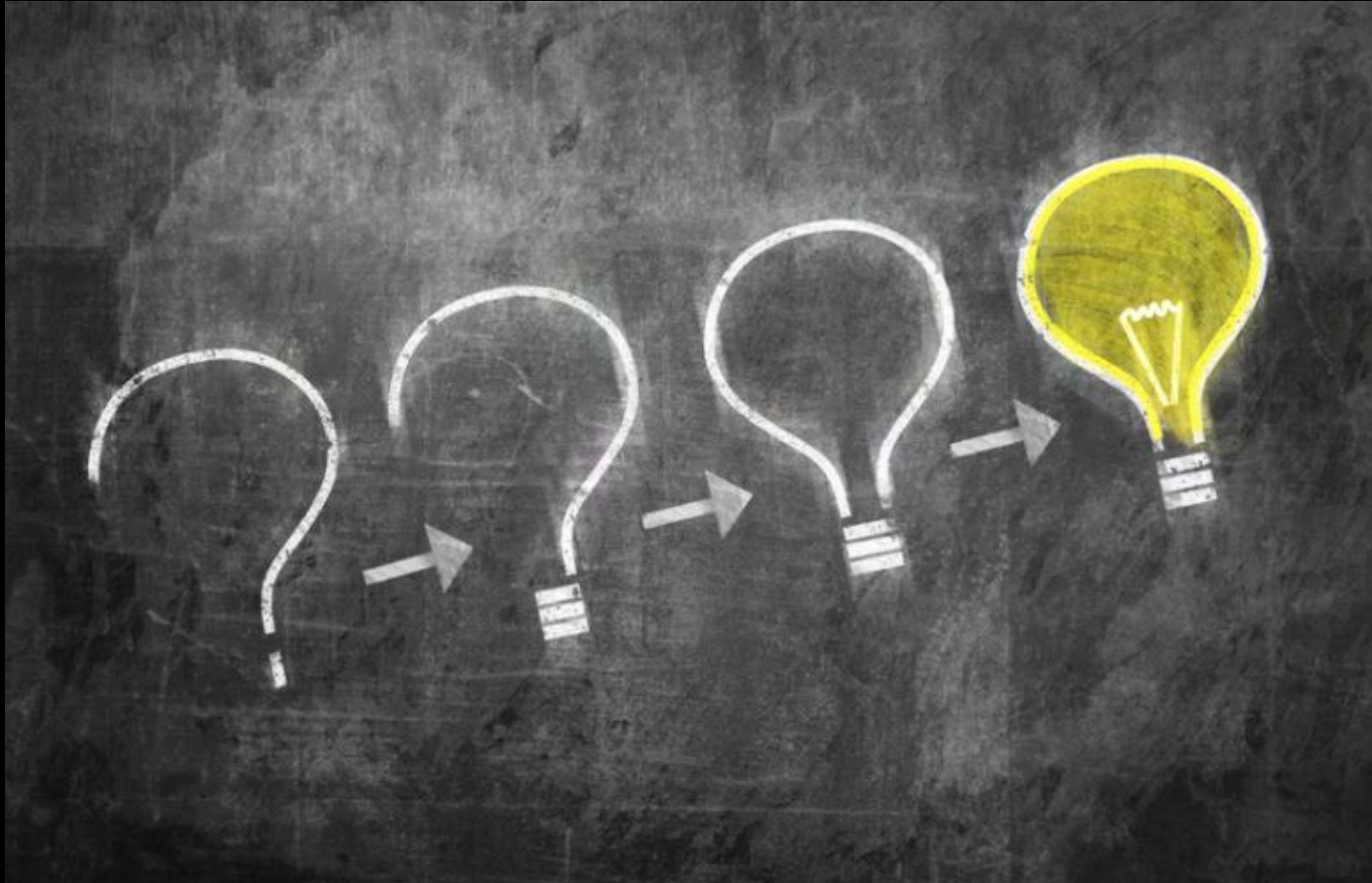

- **Nationalism:** Deep devotion to one's nation or people
Nacionalismo: profunda devoción a la propia nación o pueblo.
- **Big Scale: National Pride**
 - Your country is superior, you must be 100% loyal at all times, fighting for your country is noble. Tu país es superior
- **Smaller Scale: Ethnic Pride**
 - You believe your ethnicity or people are superior. Tu etnia o gente es superior.

Serbians wanted freedom from Austria-Hungary.

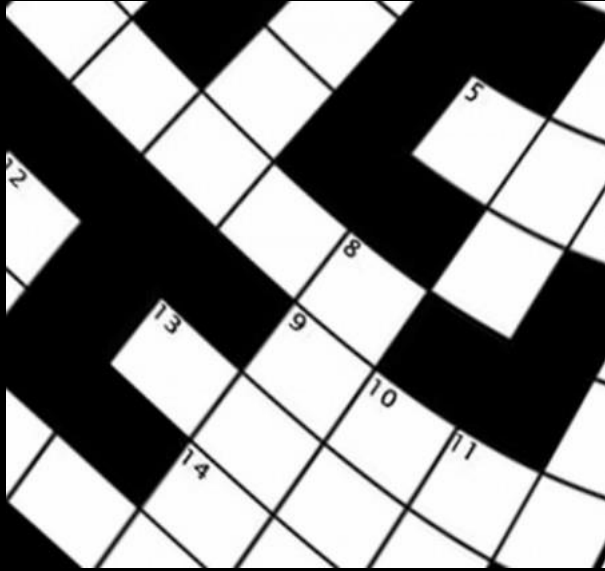

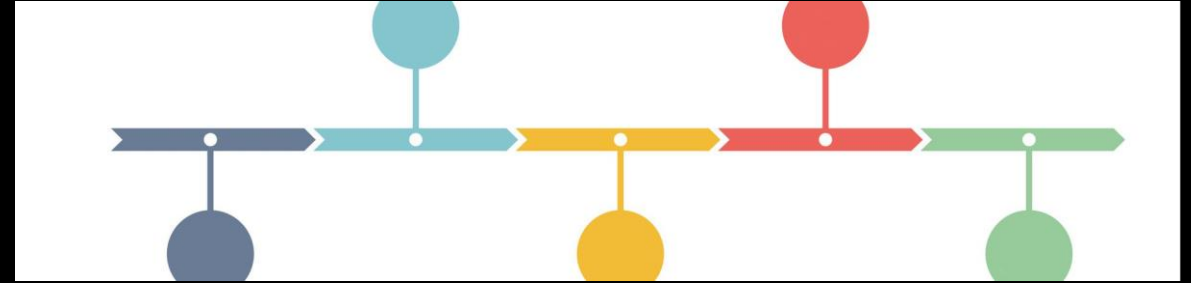
