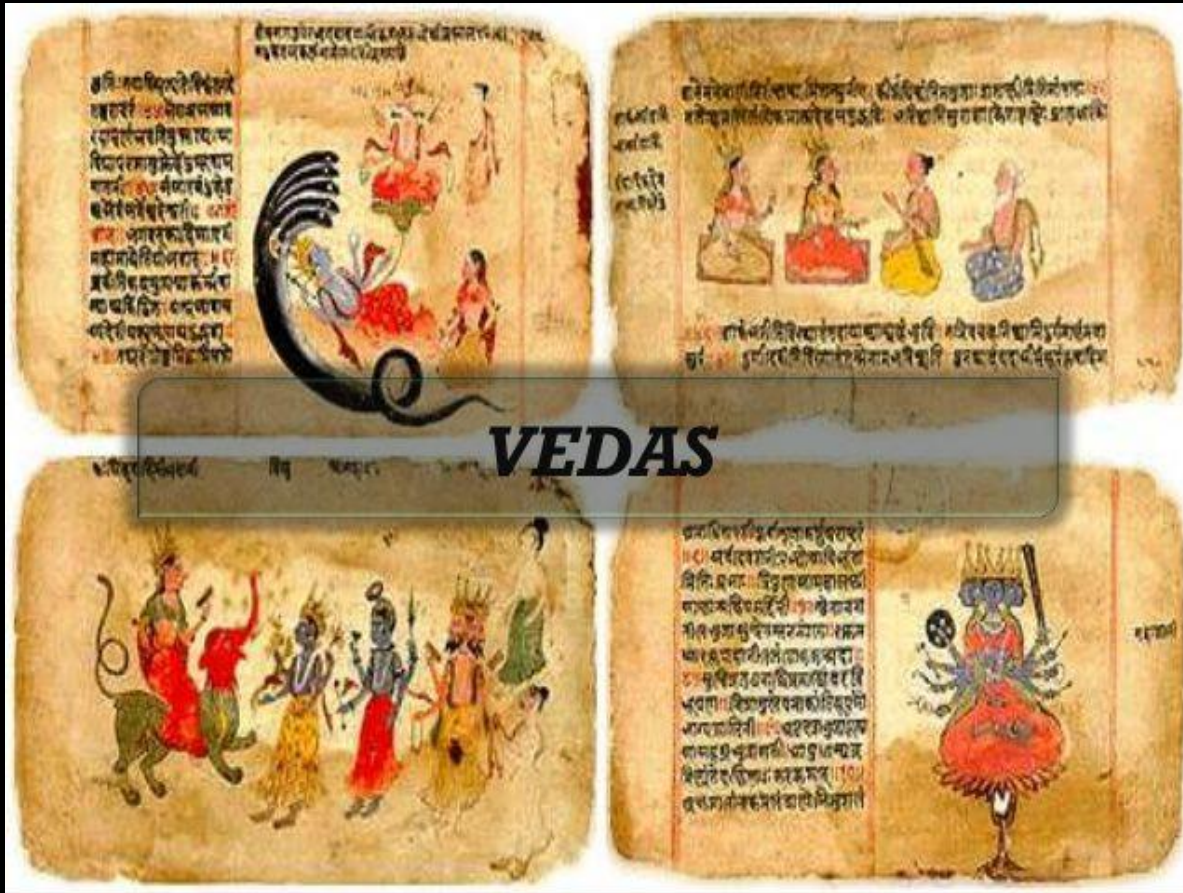
Hinduism: Origin

Buddhist Beliefs

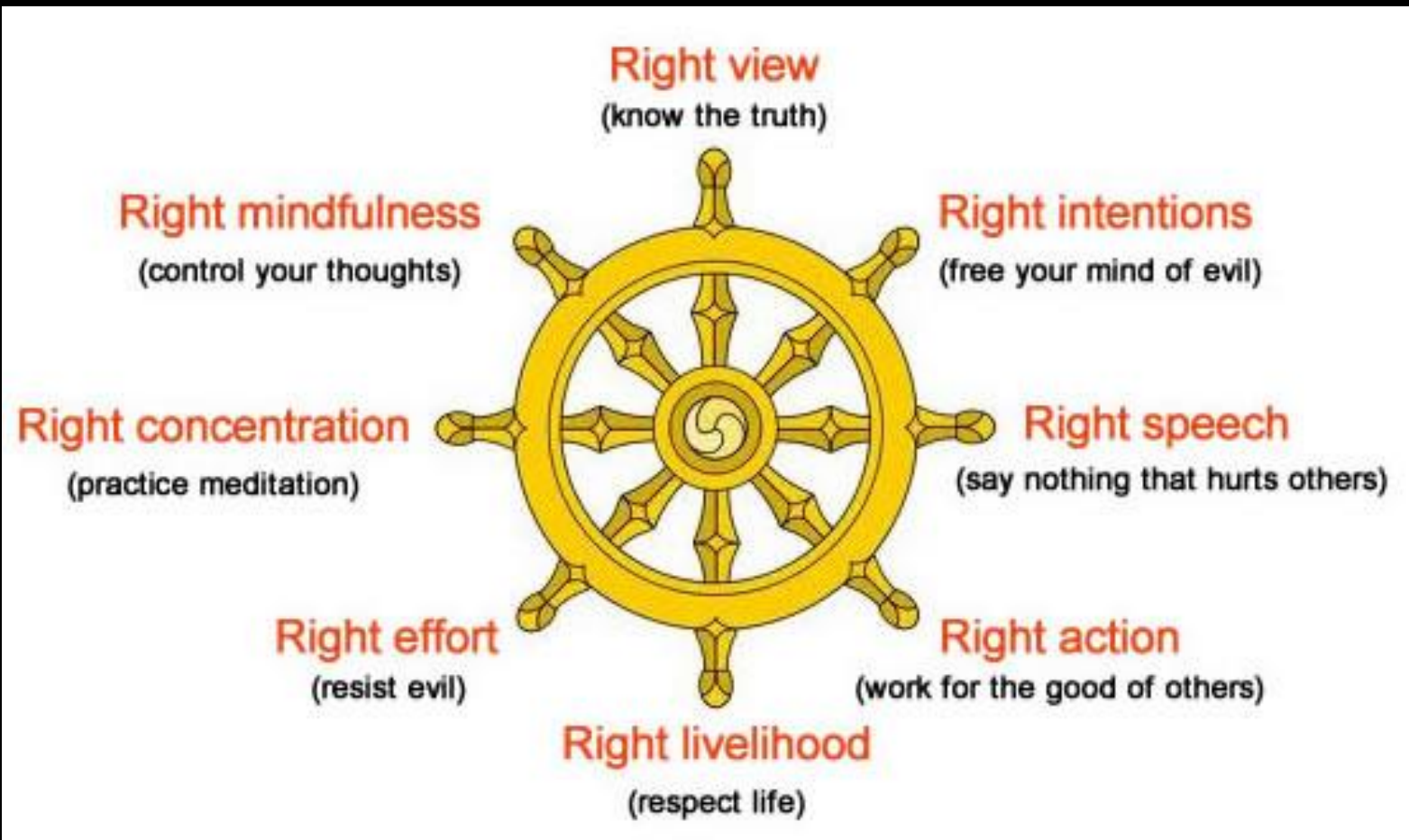
Buddha taught the Four Noble Truths to reach enlightenment or wisdom / sabiduría

1. Life is filled with suffering and sorrow.
2. Suffering is caused by people pursuing the immediate pleasures of the world.
3. The way to end suffering is to end all desires.
4. The way to end all desires is to follow the Eightfold Path leading to Nirvana.

- Reincarnated or reborn until reach the afterlife

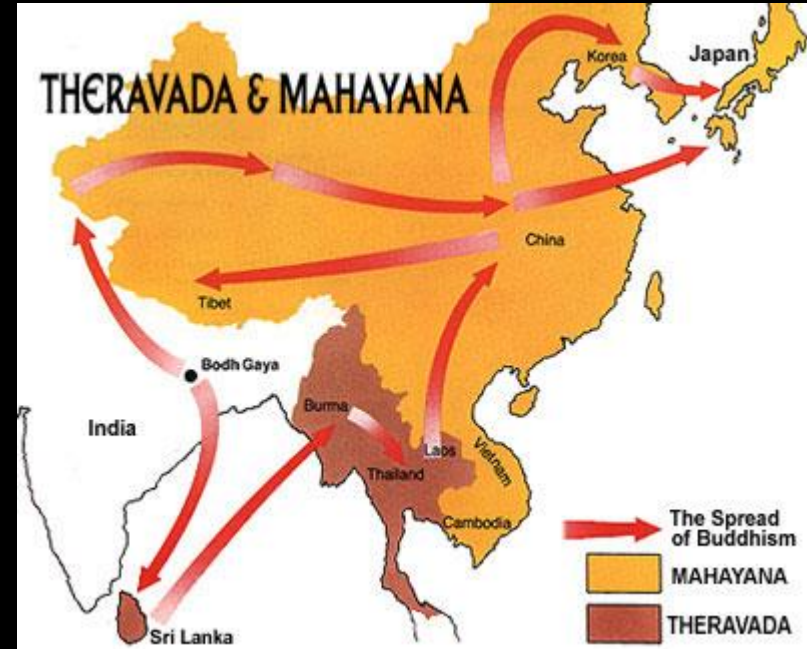


Buddhism: Temples

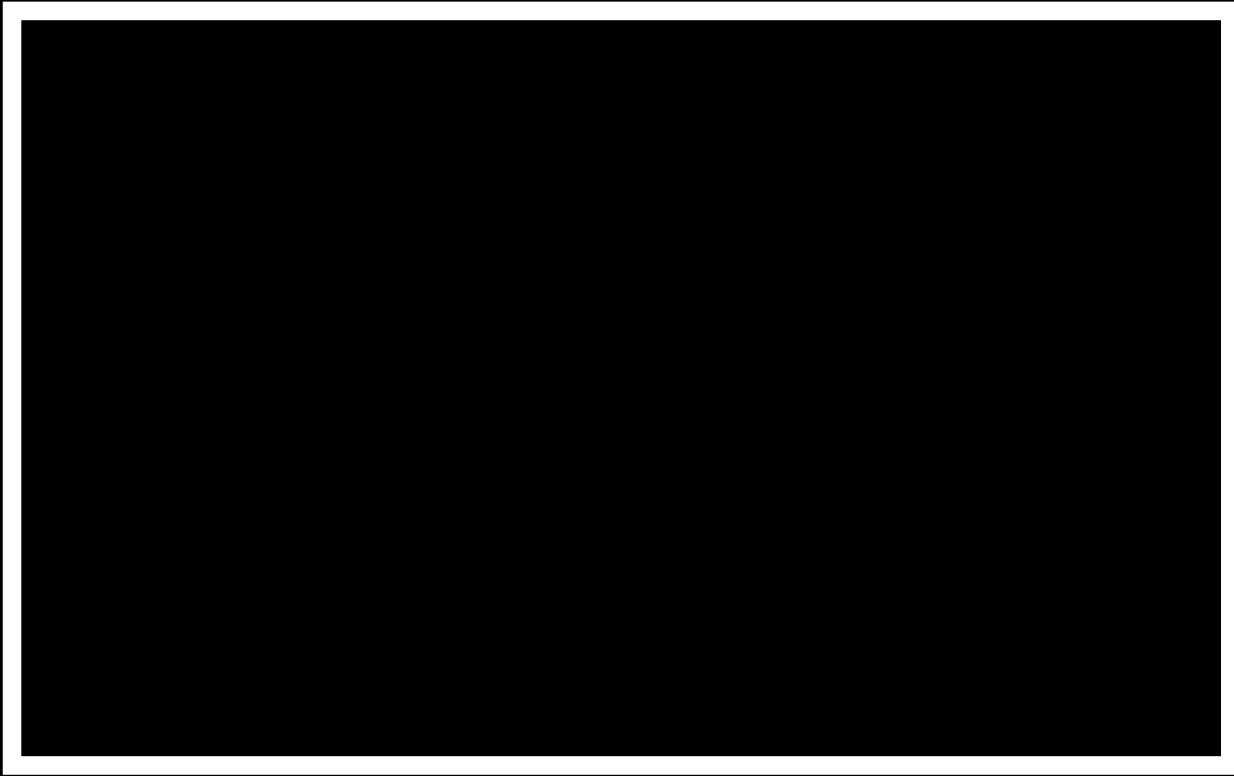

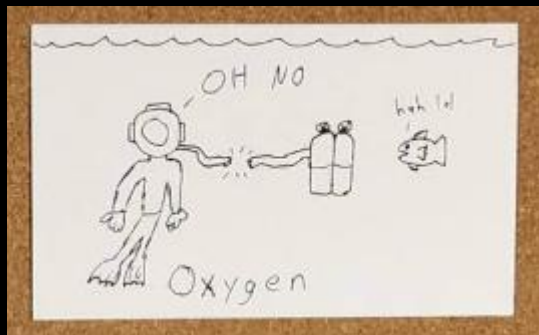
Electronic Submission Rules

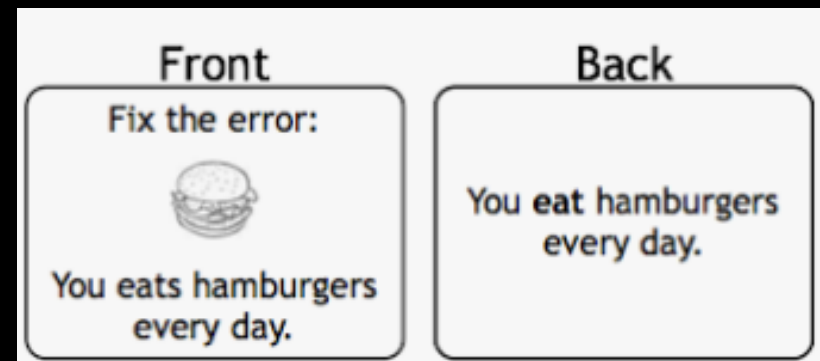
