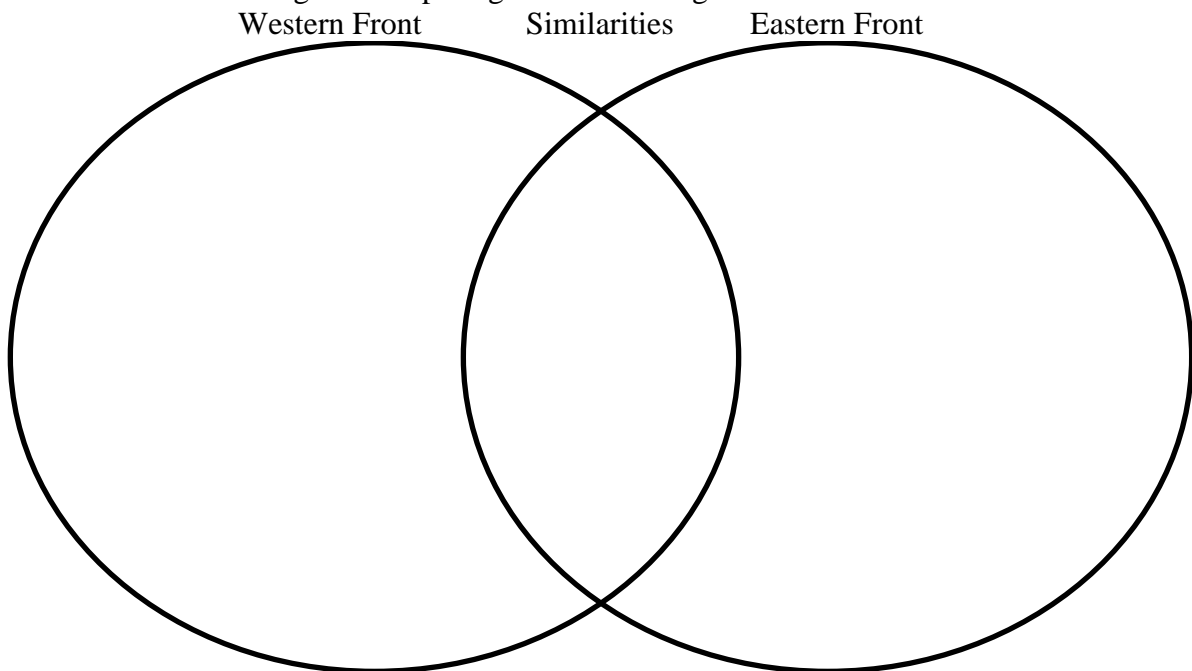

World War I Timeline

January 19, 1917 - The British intercept the Zimmerman Telegram. [A]

February 4, 1915 - The Germans use submarines against Allied ships. [B]

July 28, 1914 - Austria-Hungary declares war on Serbia. [C]

May 7, 1915 - A German submarine sinks The Lusitania. [D]

August 4, 1914 - Britain declares war on Germany. [E]

September 5 to 12, 1914 - The First Battle of the Marne. Trench warfare begins. [F]

July 1, 1916 - The Battle of the Somme begins. Over 1 million soldiers will be wounded or killed. [G]

August 1-4, 1914 - Germany declares war on Russia and France and invades Belgium (Schlieffen Plan.) [H]

April 6, 1917- The United States enters the war, declaring war on Germany. [I]

June 28, 1914 - Archduke Franz Ferdinand is assassinated. [J]
